REPORTS FROM OTTAWA

While in Ottawa, I have been hard at work in the Public Safety and National Security Committee. Thanks to the cooperation and compromise between all parties in this committee, we are finalizing a study related to gun and gang violence. The recommendations from this study have been provided by expert witnesses and will help to reduce crime and keep our communities safer.



COMBATING HATE

As part of my role as Parliamentary Secretary of Diversity and Inclusion, I have been working to help implement Canada's National Action Plan to Combat Hate. I have met with constituents of various religious, ethnic backgrounds, and organizations to hear in person some of their experiences and recommendations. These discussions have given me a renewed appreciation of our community who have channeled their energy to combatting hate in all its forms.



BUDGET 2022



This month has seen the advancement of our Budget 2022 Initiatives for Seniors. I am happy to announce that there will be increased funding and studies into senior benefit programs. These include a 10% OAS pension for seniors age 75+ starting in July, \$20 million expansion of New Horizons for

Seniors Program, \$20 million over 5 years for dementia and brain research, increased tax credit for home accessibility renovations, and much more.

We look forward to further improving the lives of the seniors in Canada.

CHILDCARE IS NOT A LUXURY



Childcare is not a luxury, it is a necessity. This month our government announced an agreement that will support an average of \$10-a-day licensed child care and save Ontario families thousands of dollars per year.

PUTTING COMMUNITY FIRST

 Last Month we attended a Norwuz celebration in Markham with our Prime Minister. Norwuz marks the first day of Spring and the renewal of nature. It promotes values of peace and solidarity between people and within families as well as contributing to cultural diversity of our country.
