During his visit, the Prime Minister and I attended a round-table discussion focused

on reducing violence in our communities by taking a multipronged approach to address the root causes of violence. The various perspectives shared at the round table will help us continue to build a society that is safe and welcoming to everyone by supporting law enforcement, targeting criminal activity and encouraging local community organizations dedicated to crime prevention. As a former York Regional Police officer, this is a topic dear to my heart and therefore a top priority of mine. I am proud of our government's actions so far, such as banning military style weapons and introducing Bill C-21 that would implement a national freeze on the sale, transfer and ownership of handguns anywhere in Canada. Report from Ottawa



e understand that even as jobs are being recovered and businesses are growing again, it has become harder for many Canadians to pay their bills at the end of the month. Many of the rising costs we have seen recently have been caused by inflation, which is occurring around the world due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and Russia's invasion of Ukraine. While these are global challenges, Canadians expect and deserve support from the federal government to help keep life affordable in Canada. Below, are some of the steps that the federal government is taking to help Canadians cope with rising costs:

- Enhancing the Canada Workers Benefit: Increasing financial support for workers.
- 2. Housing Affordability Payment: A one-time \$500 payment to those who are struggling with the cost of housing.
- 3. Dental Care for Canadians: Making dental care available to families with an income of less than \$90,000 annually.
- 4. Benefits Indexed to Inflation: Ensuring that important benefits that millions of Canadians count on, such as the Canada Child Benefit and Old Age Security, are indexed to inflation to help keep up with the cost of living.


Night It Up!

Natural Magic

he Milne Dam Conservation Park is located on the Rouge River and is one of Markham's natural treasure parks. It is

home to diverse plants and wildlife, and offers 2.3 kilometres of trails perfect for walking, jogging and biking. The expansive natural wetlands, forests and open space provide a



sanctuary for migratory birds such as blue jays, woodpeckers, blue herons, and a particular nesting pair of Baltimore orioles, making this park one of the best places for birdwatching. Park entry is free with the park open daily from Victoria Day to Thanksgiving, from 8:00 a.m. to dusk.
