## **Keeping Communities Safe**

hroughout the fall, I focused on keeping Canadians safe through our government's new legislation, Bill C-21. This legislation freezes the buying, selling, and importing of handguns across Canada. It will also provide additional tools to law

enforcement, impose more serious penalties for firearms traffickers, and protect victims of intimate partner violence. Bill C-21 is another part of our government's comprehensive approach to get guns off our streets and to make our communities safer.



#### **Fall Economic Statement**

Recently, our government released the 2022 Fall Economic Statement. This announcement outlined our ambitious plan to make life more affordable for Canadians while strengthening our industries and building a thriving net-zero economy with opportunities and jobs across the country. This plan will include:

- Permanently eliminating interest on federal student and apprentice loans;
- Delivering on key pillars of the government's plan to make housing more affordable, including the creation of a new Tax-Free First Home Savings Account, a doubling of the First-Time Home Buyers' Tax Credit, and ensuring that property flippers pay their fair share;
- Lowering credit card transaction fees for small businesses; and
- Launching the new Canada Growth Fund which will help bring to Canada the billions of dollars in new



private investment required to reduce our emissions, grow our economy, and create good jobs.

#### **Federal Government Supports**

anadians deserve support from the federal government to help keep life affordable in Canada. Through Budget 2022 and our recent announcements,



the federal government has offered a wide variety of supports to help Canadians succeed, including:

- A 10% increase on OAS payments for seniors over 75 years old;
- Doubling the GST tax credit for the next six months;
- Providing up to \$1,300 per family for children's dental care; and
- Delivering \$500 to 2 million Canadians to help pay their rent.

These measures are direct support for those who need it most, when they need it most. Our government will continue working hard to help Canadians get ahead!

### **Welcoming Newcomers to Canada**

mmigration is key to helping businesses find the workers they need and continuing to grow our economy. That's why our government's Immigration Levels Plan will ensure that Canada continues to welcome immigrants at ambitious levels, with targets of 465,000 permanent residents next year, and 500,000 per year by 2025. This plan will focus on regional needs across the country to support Canada's labour requirements and continue to build a prosperous economy for everyone. We will strengthen our immigration system by tackling the backlog, reducing wait times, supporting family reunification, and delivering a world-leading refugee resettlement program.
