

Since becoming a Member of Parliament in 2021, my biggest priority has been keeping communities safe. Last month, our



We know that assault style firearms have no place in our communities. Bill C-21 will introduce a new definition to clearly outline what constitutes an assault-style firearm to ensure such weapons that meet this definition stay off our streets.


These measures follow consultation with Canadians across the country, including hunters and trappers. They also respect and reflect the rights of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis hunters, with specific provisions.

To protect you from gun violence, our government has committed to strengthening legislation and border security, as well as increasing prevention strategies.

The first Friday of every June will mark the National Day Against Gun Violence. On this day, we will honour those who have lost their lives through gun violence and the families they left behind, and renew our commitment to the elimination of gun violence in Canada.

government passed Bill C-21 in the House of Commons, and the bill is now being reviewed by the Senate.

Bill C-21 is the strongest gun control legislation introduced into Canadian Parliament to date. This Bill will crack down on untraceable ghost guns, provide additional tools to law enforcement, and increase penalties for the criminals who smuggle and traffic firearms across our border.


